Olathe Civic Band

The Olathe Civic Band is the most recent rendition of the oldest community band in the state of Kansas. The band was formed in 1982, by Olathe Band icon, Ed Badsy. As he was nearing retirement from the Olathe School District, Mr. Badsy saw the need for a community group that would provide a musical outlet for Olathe's musicians. The band instantly began performing for many of Olathe's notable events. During its first year, the group numbered twenty-one members, several of whom still play in the band today. The band now has over one hundred members on its roster.

The Olathe Civic Band, and its sister organization, the Olathe Civic Jazz Band, perform in excess of 30 times per year. The bands have become an integral part of Olathe's culture. The Civic Band performs at the annual Memorial Day Service, The Old Time Fireworks Display at Mahaffie House, and a variety of other venues. The Jazz Band performs for many area events including Olathe's Fourth Fridays and Winterfest. The Olathe Civic Band is open to anyone, which has been the case since 1982. Membership in the Olathe Civic Jazz Band is by audition only. Admission to the performances is always free. The Olathe Civic Band is a 501(c)3 organization.

Ed Colson

Ed Colson is the director of the Olathe Civic Band, a position that he has held since 1999. After 36 years as a Kansas Educator, he retired in 2009. He served as director of bands at Pomona High School, Rosedale Middle School, Oregon Trail Junior High, and Olathe Northwest High School.

Ed graduated from Baker University in 1973. He earned his Master's from that same institution in 1988. He served as the Kansas Music Educators Association District I Junior High/Middle School Band Chair from 1983-1991. During that tenure he developed the grades 7/8 Honor Band that is still in existence today.

Ed received the National Band Association Outstanding Jazz Educator Award in 1993. He is a 10-time recipient of Who's Who of American Teachers. He is listed in the 2006 Edition of Outstanding American Teachers. Ed is a 2010 recipient of inclusion in the Presidential Who's Who as well as the Cambridge Who's Who. In 1999, he was the first recipient of the Outstanding Middle Level Music Teacher award presented by the Kansas Music Educator

Association. In 2003, Ed was inducted into the John Philip Sousa Legion of Honor at the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago, Illinois. Ed is co-founder of the Kansas Sousa Honor Band. In honor of Olathe's sesquicentennial, Ed was named number 40 on the list of the 150 most notable people in Olathe's 150-year history. Upon his retirement in 2009, Ed was honored on the floor of the Kansas Senate recognizing his service to Kansas' Public School Education. He continues to serve both as a clinician and adjudicator. He is also on the board of the Olathe's Arts Alliance.

Janet Wittkopf

Assistant Director, Janet Wittkopf taught 5th thru 12th grade band in the Gardner Edgerton school district for 33 years from 1979 to 2012. Along with her band duties she also taught first grade general music for 17 years in the Gardner Edgerton school district. Janet's first teaching position was in a small 2A school at Chase County school district in Cottonwood Falls, Kansas, near Emporia in the Flint Hills.

Miss Wittkopf earned her bachelor's degree from Emporia State University in 1978 and her master's degree from Kansas University in 1989 in Music Education. She became the head district band director and district music director for Gardner Edgerton in 1998 upon the retirement of her mentor and friend Malcolm Meyer. In 2001 she completed her administration certification from Emporia State University and became the school District Fine Arts director as well as continuing her position as the head band director. While teaching at the Gardner Edgerton school district Janet watched the school grow from a small 3A school of about 350 high school students to a 6A school of about 1400 students. As the district grew in size she assisted with the hiring of fine arts staff and the ordering of new equipment for the new buildings in the district and also in starting an orchestra program that now has over 400 students enrolled.

Miss Wittkopf's goal was to continue the legacy of success of the GEHS band program and the love of music. Since her retirement in 2012 she has been a guest conductor/clinician for various school band activities. Janet has performed with various city bands in the communities and became an assistant director for Olathe Civic Band in 2022

Doug Berg

Doug joined the Olathe Civic Jazz Band as music director in 2014. Doug has been involved in making music in some form or other for over 40 years, receiving his Bachelor of Music Education from Augustana College in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Doug retired after thirty years with the Gardner Edgerton School District where he taught vocal music, computer science, and worked in the Technology Department. Doug is currently the Choir Director at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Olathe. Doug and his wife Lisa live in southern Olathe and have three children and four grandchildren.

Kate (Berg) Camp

Kate Camp has been the vocalist with the Olathe Civic Jazz Band since 2012. She has been blessed to have this opportunity to sing her favorite music with such an amazing band. Kate works for Empower Retirement as a Senior Manager of Operations. She enjoys traveling with her husband Kris and going on adventures with her two little boys, Anders and Rhodes.

Gavin Lendt

Gavin Lendt has written numerous award-winning works for band, orchestra and choir and is a highly sought-after composer. In addition to his compositional skills, he also works as an audio-recording engineer, graphic designer, a video director, and an online content creator. His solo works are published through JPM Music and his works for band have been published with Randall Standridge Music and Grand Mesa Music. He is also the current director of the Kansas City Horn Club and plays horn in many orchestras and bands throughout the Kansas City area.
